KATHLEEN GALLEGOS, has been reappointed to the California Arts Council, where she has served since 2014. She has been director of Avenue 50 Studio Inc. since 2000, and an independent artist since 1992. Gallegos was a legal secretary at Stutman Treister and Glatt from 1987 to 2002. Reappointed 02/15/2018. Effective 02/22/2018.

Member, California Arts Council, vice, self, reappointed. Term ending 01/01/2022.

HILDEGARDE B. AGUINALDO, has been appointed to the California Community Colleges Board of Governors. Aguinaldo has been associate general counsel at United Healthcare since 2017. She was general counsel at the Santa Maria Group from 2016 to 2017, and an associate and clerk at Lewis Brisbois Bisgaard and Smith LLP from 2008 to 2016. Aguinaldo served as deputy of health and legal affairs in the Office of Los Angeles City Council member Richard Alarcón from 2007 to 2008. She is a member of the Los Angeles County Hospitals and Health Care Delivery Commission, and was a member of the Northridge Hospital Medical Center Community Board from 2008 to 2014. Aguinaldo earned a Juris Doctor degree from Southwestern Law School and a Master of Public Health degree in health services organization from the University of California, Los Angeles. Tatayon has held several positions at the Nature Conservancy since 2006, including water program director and associate director for the California water program.
