Re: SB 1013 (Lara)—The California Cooling Act

Dear Mr. Alvarez: I submit this letter to the Senate Journal for the purpose of clarifying the intent of SB 1013, the California Cooling Act. SB 1013 adopts all prohibitions on the use of class I substances and class II substances as set forth in 42 U.S.C. Secs. 7671a and 7671k, as those read on November 15, 1990, or any substitute as set forth in Appendix U and Appendix V of Subpart G of 40 C.F.R. Part 82, as those read on January 3, 2017, shall apply, except when otherwise provided in SB 1013, state statute, state regulation. To address two scenarios, we have noted where SB 1013 is different from the United States Environmental Protection Agency regulations. First, as clearly stated in paragraph (c) (2) there is a process to address previously prohibited hydrofluorocarbon blends for foam blowing pursuant to the Significant New Alternatives Policy Program, adopted pursuant to Section 7671k of the federal Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. Sec. 7401 et seq.), the state board is authorized and directed to expeditiously initiate a rulemaking pursuant to this section or other existing legal authority to conform its regulations with that federal action. In addition, SB 1013, in (c) (3), states that the prohibitions on certain residential consumer refrigeration products shall take effect on the dates in SB 1013, rather than in the original United States Environmental Protection Agency regulations.

Dear Mr. Alvarez: This letter is to clarify the intent of SB 1083. Sections 2 and 2.5 of SB 1083 contains a drafting error. This error was discovered too late for amending in the 2017–18 legislative session. Therefore, it is my intent to correct this error in the next legislative session.

In Section 2 and Section 2.5 of the proposal, Health & Safety Code Section 1517.1 (b) (4) is intended to apply to **all foster family homes**. As drafted, (b) (4) (B) would erroneously make that apply to a *certified family home*. It is my intent to correct this error in the next legislative session by reverting to law as it existed prior to the amendment that was made to this section as a result of SB 1083, as indicated in the next paragraph.



Section 1517.1 of the Health and Safety Code is amended to read:

1517.1

(b) (1) The applicable licensure and oversight processes shall continue to be administered for foster family homes licensed prior to January 1, 2017, or as specified in paragraph (2), until the license is revoked or forfeited by operation of law pursuant to this section or Section 1524 of the Health and Safety Code.

(2) The department shall approve or deny all foster family home license applications received on or before December 31, 2016, in accordance with this chapter.

(3) On and after January 1, 2017, the department shall not accept applications to license foster family homes.

(4) The following shall apply to all foster family homes:

(A) A foster family home with an approved adoptive home study, completed prior to January 1, 2018, shall be deemed to be a resource family.

(B) A ~~foster~~ *certified* family home that had a child in placement ~~for~~ *at* any ~~length of~~ time between January 1, 2017, and December 31, 2017, inclusive, may be approved as a resource family on the date of successful completion of a psychosocial assessment pursuant to Section 16519.5 of the Welfare and Institutions Code.
