Lord, may You continue to bless and guide our esteemed legislators as they faithfully serve with honesty and integrity for the best interests for our beloved State of California and all of its residents. May Your blessings, peace, and protection be upon the leadership, armed forces, and citizenry of the United States and all peace loving nations. Today, as we pay tribute to the victims of the Armenian Genocide, remember all those who have undergone a similar fate, praying for the rest of their souls in heaven. We humbly bow before You in praise and gratitude for Your love, mercy, and Your abundant gifts.—AMEN.
