Senate Bill 299: By Senator Jackson—An act to amend Section 1798.81.5 of the Civil Code, relating to privacy.

Senate Bill 300: By Senator Umberg—An act to amend Section 82043 of the Government Code, relating to the Political Reform Act of 1974.

Senate Bill 301: By Senator Leyva—An act to amend Section 24001 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to family planning.



Senate Bill 302: By Senator Portantino (Principal coauthor: Senator Wilk) (Coauthors: Senators Hurtado, Stern, and Wiener) (Coauthors: Assembly Members Burke and Low)—An act to add and repeal Section 13996.43 of the Government Code, relating to economic development.

Senate Bill 303: By Senator Wieckowski—An act to amend Section 2640 of the Probate Code, relating to guardians and conservators.
