GAVIN NEWSOM, Governor

BRIAN J. JOHNSON, has been appointed to the Central Valley Flood Protection Board. Johnson has been California director at Trout Unlimited since 2011, where he was director of the California water program from 2005 to 2011. He was an associate at Shute, Mihaly & Weingerger LLP from 2000 to 2005, associate director for communications at the Council on Environmental Quality, Executive Office of the President from 1993 to 1997, and manager of Energy Star Computers for the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Office of Air and Radiation from 1991 to 1993. Johnson earned a Juris Doctor degree from Stanford Law School. Appointed 01/16/2020. Effective 01/31/2020.

Member, Central Valley Flood Protection Board, vice, Emma Suarez Pawlicki, resigned 04/01/2019. Term ending 01/01/2024.

JACEY K. COOPER, has been appointed state Medicaid director and chief deputy director of health care programs at the Department of Health Care Services. Cooper has been senior advisor of health care programs and assistant deputy director of health care delivery systems at the Department of Health Care Services since 2016. She was vice president at Meridian Healthcare Partners and vice president of administrative services at the Kern Medical Center from 2014 to 2016. She held several positions at Kern Medical Center from 2010 to 2014, including special projects manager and executive director of managed care. Cooper was a senior project manager at COPE Health Solutions from 2009 to 2010 and held several positions at Marsh ClearSight LLC from 2005 to 2009, including quality assurance analyst and product manager. Appointed 01/16/2020. Effective 01/31/2020.
