GAVIN NEWSOM, Governor

JONATHAN D. MOSCONE, has been appointed to the California Arts Council. Moscone has been chief producer of Yerba Buena Center for the Arts since 2015. He was artistic director of the California Shakespeare Theater from 2000 to 2015. He is a member of the Homeless Prenatal Program Board of Directors and the board of Alice Waters' Edible Schoolyard Project. Moscone earned a Master of Fine Arts degree in directing from the Yale School of Drama. Appointed 01/28/2020. Effective 02/14/2020.

Member, California Arts Council, vice, Louise McGuinness, not confirmed. Term ending 01/01/2023.

SHARON A. HILLIARD, has been appointed director of the Employment Development Department. Hilliard has been chief deputy director at the Employment Development Department since 2013, where she has held multiple positions since 1983, including deputy director of the tax branch, chief of the field audit and compliance division, chief of the tax processing and accounting division, chief of central operations, and chief of underground economy operations. Appointed 01/28/2020. Effective 02/11/2020.

Director, Employment Development Department, vice, Patrick Henning Jr., resigned 01/03/2020. Term ending at the pleasure of the Governor.



BRADLEY P. GILBERT, has been appointed director of the California Department of Health Care Services. Gilbert has been a retired annuitant at the Inland Empire Health Plan since 2019, where he has held several positions since 1996, including medical director, chief medical officer, and chief executive officer. He was director of public health at the County of Riverside Health Services Agency Department of Public Health from 1993 to 1996. Gilbert was director of public health at the San Mateo County Department of Health Services Division of Public Health. He is a board member of the California Healthcare Foundation, Planned Parenthood, and Manifest Medex. Gilbert earned a Master of Public Policy degree from the University of California, Berkeley and a Doctor of Medicine degree from the University of California, San Diego School of Medicine. Appointed 01/28/2020. Effective 02/24/2020.

Director, Department of Health Care Services, vice, Jennifer B. Kent, resigned 09/27/2019. Term ending at the pleasure of the Governor.

NORMA CUMPIAN, has been appointed to the Board of State and Community Corrections. Cumpian has served as the manager for women and non-binary services at the Anti-Recidivism Coalition since 2016. She was a volunteer coordinator at the Center for Restorative Justice Works from 2010 to 2015. Cumpian is a member of the Los Angeles County Gender Responsive Advisory Committee. She also helped organize and lead Convicted Women Against Abuse, a self-help organization that brings women a better understanding of domestic violence. Appointed 02/12/2020. Effective 02/13/2020.

Member, Board of State and Community Corrections, vice, Francine M. Kerridge, resigned 11/06/2019. Term ending 07/01/2020.

DAVID L. SIMMONS, has been appointed to the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing. Simmons has served as assistant superintendent for the Goleta Union School District since 2017. He was assistant superintendent of personnel services at the Ventura County Office of Education from 2005 to 2017. Simmons was a high school mathematics teacher for the Ventura Unified School District from 1989 to 2005. He earned a Master of Arts degree in educational administration from California State University, Northridge. Appointed 01/28/2020. Effective 02/05/2020.

Member, Commission on Teacher Credentialing, vice, Castle W. Redmond, term expired. Term ending 11/20/2023.



KAREN S. YAMAMOTO, has been reappointed to the California State Teachers' Retirement Board, where she has served since 2017. Yamamoto was a second grade teacher for the Washington Unified School District from 1992 to 2007. She is a member of the Japanese American Citizens League, Florin Chapter, the Asian Pacific Youth Leadership Project, and the Buddhist Church of Sacramento. Yamamoto earned a Master of Arts degree in early childhood education from California State University, Sacramento. Reappointed 02/12/2020. Effective 02/21/2020.
