GAVIN NEWSOM, Governor

POLLY SEAVER-CODORNIZ, has been reappointed to the California Board of Barbering and Cosmetology, where she has served since 2015. Seaver-Codorniz has been co-owner at Changes Salon since 2013. She was co-owner at Shear Class from 1986 to 2013. Seaver-Codorniz is a member of the California Cosmetology Association. Reappointed 01/02/2019. Effective 01/07/2019.

Member, State Board of Barbering and Cosmetology, vice, self, reappointed. Term ending 01/01/2023.

BETTY WILSON, has been reappointed to the California Commission on Disability Access, where she has served since 2010. Wilson has been owner and consultant at Betty R. Wilson and Associates since 2012. She held several positions at the Los Angeles Department on Disability from 1989 to 2012, including director of community services, assistant director, and administrative coordinator. Wilson was executive director of the Mayor's Office for the Disabled from 1981 to 1989, and senior research associate for the Neuropsychiatric Institute Sociobehavioral Group at the University of California, Los Angeles from 1979 to 1981. She is a member of the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights' California Advisory Committee. Wilson earned a Master of Arts degree in psychology from California State University, Los Angeles. Reappointed 01/02/2019. Effective 01/07/2019.

Member, California Commission on Disability Access, vice, self, reappointed. Term ending 01/01/2022.



JARED BLUMENFELD, has been appointed Secretary of the California Environmental Protection Agency (CalEPA), the state cabinet-level agency established in 1991 to restore, protect and enhance the environment, and to ensure public health, environmental quality, and economic vitality. Blumenfeld is widely recognized as one of America's most innovative environmental leaders. In 2016, he founded his own private firm advising clean tech companies in best practices after serving eight successful years as Regional Administrator of the United States Environmental Protection Agency for the Pacific Southwest, including California, Arizona, Hawaii, Nevada, the Pacific Islands, and 148 tribal nations, under President Barack Obama. Previously, he was Director of the San Francisco Department of Environment for nine years, where he and then-Mayor Newsom worked effectively to make San Francisco the most sustainable city in the nation. He also served as General Manager of the San Francisco Recreation and Park Department, Director of the Treasure Island Redevelopment Authority, Chairman of United Nations World Environment Day, Director of Habitat Protection at the International Fund for Animal Welfare, and Executive Director of Earth Summit Watch for the Natural Resources Defense Council (NRDC). He graduated from Cambridge College of Arts and Technology, earned a Master of Laws degree from the University of California, Berkeley School of Law, and a Bachelor of Laws degree from the University of London. Appointed 01/07/2019. Effective 01/07/2019.

Secretary, California Environmental Protection Agency, vice, James Matthew Rodriquez, resigned 01/06/2019. Term ending at the pleasure of the Governor.

THOMAS PORTER, has been appointed Director of the Department of Forestry and Fire Protection. Porter is currently serving as Acting Director at CAL FIRE, where he will continue to serve as the appointed Director. Porter began his career with CAL FIRE in 1999 and has held multiple responsibilities, including vegetation management, pre-fire programs, and fuel management grant programs. Porter was promoted to Southern Region Chief in 2015, and later to Chief of Strategic Planning. Appointed 01/08/2019. Effective 01/11/2019.

Director, Department of Forestry and Fire Protection, vice, Kenneth Pimlott, retired 12/14/2018. Term ending at the pleasure of the Governor.



JULIE SU, has been appointed Secretary of the California Labor and Workforce Development Agency. From 2011 to 2018, she served as California's Labor Commissioner in Governor Edmund G. Brown Jr.'s administration. Prior to being appointed Labor Commissioner, she served as the Litigation Director at Advancing Justice LA. She has spent 17 years of her career as a civil rights lawyer with a focus on protecting low-wage workers, and immigrant victims of crime and human trafficking. Appointed 01/11/2019. Effective 01/11/2019.

Secretary, California Labor and Workforce Development Agency, vice, David M. Lanier, resigned 01/10/2019. Term ending at the pleasure of the Governor.

WADE CROWFOOT, has been appointed Secretary of the California Natural Resources Agency. Crowfoot was chief executive officer of the Water Foundation from 2016 to 2018. He was deputy cabinet secretary and senior advisor to Governor Edmund G. Brown Jr. from 2013 to 2016. Crowfoot also served as deputy director for Governor Brown's Office of Planning and Research from 2011 to 2013. He was West Coast political director at the Environmental Defense Fund from 2009 to 2011, and senior environmental advisor to former San Francisco Mayor Gavin Newsom from 2004 to 2007. Appointed 01/11/2019. Effective 01/11/2019.

Secretary, California Natural Resources Agency, vice, John Laird, resigned 01/07/2019. Term ending at the pleasure of the Governor.
