Dear Danny: I write in reference to the recent raise of 3% granted by the California Citizens Compensation Commission to California's elected state officials, effective December 2017. This letter is to provide formal notification to the Senate, through you in your capacity as Secretary of the Senate, that it is my wish to decline and forego any increase to my state-funded annual salary at the current time.

I am aware that the most recent increase is the result of deliberations by the non-partisan Citizens Compensation Commission, which was created in 1990 by the passage of Proposition 112. Having been recently elected, and out of consideration of the challenges currently confronting so many hard-working Californians, I have decided to forego any increase in my own compensation in the coming year.

I do appreciate the work of the Commission, and I don't begrudge any of the hard-working members of California's Legislature, constitutional officers, or other civil servants any increase in compensation they may be due to receive as a result of the Commission's recent action. For my part, however, the current opportunity to serve is sufficient, and I respectfully decline any pay increase as part of the current cycle.
