She served as policy director in the Office of California State Senator Dean Florez from 2008 to 2009, as a policy consultant in the Office of California State Senate President pro Tempore Don Perata from 2005 to 2008, and district director in the Office of California State Senator Don Perata from 2001 to 2005.
