GAVIN NEWSOM, Governor

DAVID R. HOCHSCHILD, has been reappointed to the State Energy Resources Conservation and Development Commission, where he has served since 2013. Hochschild was vice president of external affairs at Solaria Corporation from 2007 to 2013. He was executive director at PV Now from 2005 to 2007, and co-founder and director of policy at the Vote Solar Initiative from 2002 to 2005. Hochschild was special assistant to San Francisco Mayor Willie Brown from 2000 to 2001 and program director at The President's Award, Port Alfred, South Africa from 1996 to 1997. Hochschild served as a member of the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission from 2007 to 2008. Reappointed 01/07/2019. Effective 01/17/2019.

Member, State Energy Resources Conservation and Development Commission, vice, self, reappointed. Term ending 01/06/2024.

SEVERIN BORENSTEIN, has been appointed to the California Independent System Operator Governing Board. Borenstein has been professor at the University of California at Berkeley Haas School of Business since 1996. He was a professor of economics at the University of California at Davis from 1989 to 1996, and an assistant professor of economics at the University of Michigan from 1983 to 1989. Borenstein served as staff economist for the United States Civil Aeronautics Board from 1978 to 1979. Appointed 01/17/2019. Effective 01/28/2019.

Member, Independent System Operator Governing Board, vice, Mark Ferron, term expired. Term ending 12/31/2021.



DAVID B. OLSEN, has been reappointed to the California Independent System Operator Governing Board, where he has served since 2012. Olsen was the managing director for the Western Grid Group from 2003 to 2013, and served as coordinator for the California Renewable Energy Transmission Initiative for the California Energy Commission from 2007 to 2010. He was a coordinator for the Tehachapi Collaborative Study Group from 2005 to 2007. Olsen was president of Clipper Windpower Development from 2001 to 2003 and CEO at Patagonia Inc. from 1996 to 1999. He was vice president of Magma Power Company from 1988 to 1995 and president and CEO of Northern Power Systems from 1984 to 1988. Reappointed 01/22/2019. Effective 01/26/2019.
