**Senate Bill 274:** By Senator Dodd—An act to amend Sections 798.34 and 798.74 of, and to add Section 798.62 to, the Civil Code, relating to mobilehome residency.

**Senate Bill 275:** By Senator Pan—An act to amend Section 2960.1 of the Business and Professions Code, relating to healing arts.

**Senate Bill 276:** By Senator Pan—An act to amend Section 25101 of the Health and Safety Code, relating to hazardous waste.

**Senate Bill 282:** By Senator Beall—An act to add Chapter 2.9 (commencing with Section 50492) to Part 2 of Division 3 of the Health and Safety Code, and to add Section 2985.6 to, and to repeal Article 5 (commencing with Section 2985) of Chapter 7 of Title 1 of Part 3 of, the Penal Code, relating to supportive housing.

**Senate Bill 283:** By Senator Bates (Principal coauthor: Assembly Member Brough)—An act to amend Section 27491.25 of the Government Code, and to amend Section 20011 of the Vehicle Code, relating to fatal vehicular accidents.

**Senate Bill 284:** By Senator Beall (Coauthor: Senator Portantino) (Coauthors: Assembly Members Chiu, Gipson, and McCarty)—An act to amend Section 912 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to juveniles.

**Senate Bill 285:** By Senator Wiener (Coauthor: Senator Dodd) (Coauthor: Assembly Member Wicks)—An act to add Sections 10618.4, 18900.3, and 18900.4 to the Welfare and Institutions Code, relating to public social services.
