Dear Ms. Contreras: I submit this letter to the Senate Journal for the purpose of clarifying the intent of Senate Bill 24, which I introduced to expand access to abortion by medication techniques at each California State University (CSU) and University of California (UC) campus on or after January 1, 2023.

SB 24 intends to provide adequate financial resources, as well as a substantial three-year implementation period, to ensure that student health centers on all UC and CSU campuses are ready to provide abortion by medication techniques. The funding can be used for clinician training, equipment, and other infrastructure needs.



Since each campus has unique infrastructure circumstances and resource availability, I understand the need to arrive at a tailored implementation path in order for each university to come into compliance with SB 24. I hereby commit to addressing at the earliest opportunity, and before SB 24's mandate takes effect on January 1, 2023, an alternative pathway for CSU Maritime Academy, CSU Channel Islands, and CSU Monterey Bay to offer medication abortion services, if indeed this is needed, to students on or off-campus while ensuring logistical and financial barriers to this care are removed to the greatest extent possible.

As such, I firmly believe that SB 24 allows enough time and flexibility for all UC and CSU campuses to provide this basic health service.

Thank you for this opportunity to clarify the intent of SB 24.

Dear Secretary Contreras: I am writing as a co-author of Assembly Bill 25, and as a co-author of the California Consumer Privacy Act (“CCPA”), to clarify my intention with regard to how the CCPA is intended to apply to the transfer of “personal information” for a “business purpose.”

Generally, the CCPA does not classify such transfers as “sales.” That is, provided certain contracting requirements are met, Section 1798.140(w)(2)(A) expressly excludes from the definition of “third party,” “a person to whom the business discloses a consumer’s personal information for a business purpose.” In this way, the Act excludes the transfer of personal information for a business purpose from the CCPA’s “sale” definition, because the recipient was not a “third party,” pursuant to 1798.140(w)(2). The Act further identifies certain “business purposes” that qualify for this exclusion and requires appropriate notice, use limitations, and data minimization practices for conducting these kinds of transfers.

During discussions this year as we crafted AB 25, concern was expressed that the definition of “sale” in Section 1798.140(t)(1) could be construed to limit the authority of a business to transfer information for a business purpose to an entity meeting the requirements of Section 1798.140(w)(2)(A). Section 1798(t)(1) provides in pertinent part: “Sell . . . means . . . transferring . . . a consumer’s personal information by the business to another business or a third party” Some commentators have suggested this language could be read to mean that a transfer for a business purpose, even if not a transfer to a “third party,” could nonetheless be a transfer to “another business” and therefore characterized as a “sale.” Such a reading could render virtually meaningless the ability to share information for a “business purpose” to entities that are excluded from the definition of “third party” and are not “service providers.” Concern has also been expressed that addressing this issue should not inadvertently create a loophole by allowing anyone other than the business with whom the consumer intends to interact, to be a business who collects data from a consumer under this title, pursuant to Section 1798.140(w)(1).



It was not my intent to render the ability to share information with a “service provider” or a person described in 1798.140(w)(2), only pursuant to a business purpose, meaningless. In turn, it is not my intent to create a loophole in addressing this issue. I intend to pursue clarifying amendments when the Legislature convenes in January.

Dear Ms. Contreras: I have authored SB 313, which would prohibit a person from sponsoring, conducting, or operating a circus, as defined, in this state that uses any animal other than a domestic dog, domestic cat, or domesticated horse. Sections 2210(b) and 2210(c)(3) are not intended to mandate the California Department of Food and Agriculture to act as an enforcement agency. As written, and consistent with the legislative intent, the enforcement authority is to be read as permissive. If the Department of Food and Agriculture views this policy as outside of their existing jurisdiction, SB 313 shall not be considered a directive upon them to execute that enforcement authority. Should this legislation be signed into law, it is my intent to introduce a subsequent measure if this matter is in need of greater certainty.

Dear Ms. Contreras, The purpose of this letter is to memorialize a remaining question stakeholders have raised regarding the potential implementation of my bill SB 330—The Housing Crisis Act, and to voice the intent of the provisions of the bill pertaining to historic status.

SB 330 will sunset on January 1, 2025, but stakeholders have raised a question about the impact of SB 330 should the Legislature choose to extend the sunset past 2025. Specifically, part of the bill establishes new limitations on the ability of local governments to subject housing development projects to changed policies, standards, and other requirements. Some stakeholders expressed concern during the bill's progress, that these provisions as enacted may not be appropriate for very large housing projects, on the scale of a master planned community, which take several years or even decades to build. Other stakeholders disagreed. Through this letter, I advise future legislatures who may wish to consider extending the sunset on SB 330 to consider the impacts of SB 330 on very large housing projects, and whether there is a need to adjust the scope or application of SB 330 to these projects.

Secondly, stakeholders have raised questions as to provisions of the bill that lock in historic status of a property when an applicant submits a preliminary application. I wish to clarify that the requirement in Government Code Section 65941.1(a)(9) that an applicant for a housing development project provide information about "any historic or cultural resources known to exist on the property" is not intended to conclusively establish whether historic or cultural resources may be located within the property for the purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act.

Thank you for this opportunity to opine on these remaining questions about the implementation of SB 330, should the Legislature ever extend its sunset date.

Dear Secretary Contreras: I am writing to request that the following letter be entered into the Senate Daily Journal:

As the author of SB 1, my office was contacted by Assembly Member Jacqui Irwin today expressing concern about the potential impact of this measure on the Santa Clara River Project sponsored by the United Water Conservation District in the Oxnard Region.

The district is working to address anadromous species project impacts through a federal Habitat Conservation Plan. The plan is not yet approved at the federal level, but the State Department of Fish and Wildlife has apparently accepted the plan's mitigation in its consulting role.

It is not my intent that SB 1 affect the Santa Clara River Project as it is proposed, and provided it continues to maintain the standards and protections from the biological opinions under which the draft HCP has been proposed.

SB 1 only triggers where an action is taken by a federal agency to roll back a federal environmental or worker protection standard. I am unaware of any such rollbacks contemplated for the fish species addressed in the HCP, and no such rollbacks have been proposed for HCPs themselves. Therefore, SB 1 would not affect this project or its HCP as currently contemplated.

The district expressed additional concerns that SB 1 would "lock in old science" or lead to new litigation not already authorized under current law. SB 1 does not require the use of "old science" or outdated information. Furthermore, it does not create any new cause of action beyond that already available under current federal law.

I hope this letter clarifies my intent with respect to SB 1 and the Santa Clara Project.
