SUSAN A. BONILLA, has been appointed to the California Alcoholic Beverage Control Appeals Board. Bonilla has served as California state director for the Council for a Strong America since 2017. She served as an Assembly Member in the California State Assembly from 2010 to 2016. Bonilla earned a Master of Education degree in educational leadership from Concordia University. Appointed 03/25/2019. Effective 04/04/2019.
